



MT OSMOND GOLF CLUB DRESS CODE

Members and their guests must be dressed in a manner that does not detract from the dignity of the Club.

The General Manager, Club Professional or his staff and Board members have the authority to enforce the dress regulations. Members who believe dress standards have been breached should report the matter to any of the above without incurring embarrassment to others.

It is the responsibility of all members to ensure that their guests are aware of and adhere to the Club's dress standards.

Course

For both men and women clothing that is worn by professional golfers is deemed acceptable.

Men's shirts must have a collar or be a turtle neck golf shirt.

Denim clothing is not permitted to be worn on course.

Clubhouse

We encourage members and their guest to enjoy the hospitality within the clubhouse in a relaxed and convivial way whilst maintaining the dignity of the club.

Accordingly members and their guests are required to dress in a neat casual style as a minimum standard.

Members and guests may now wear smart denim that is in good order and men can wear dress shirts that are untucked.

Casual moccasin style or boat shoes may be worn without socks.

Dress that is acceptable on the course is acceptable within the clubhouse. Hats may not be worn in the upper level of the clubhouse.

The Board may stipulate a certain standard of dress for special occasions.

Golf shoes may only be worn in the Member's Bar and the lower level of the clubhouse.

The following are not allowed to be worn on course or within the clubhouse:

- Metal spiked golf shoes
- Tracksuits and drawstring or elasticised waist trousers
- Rubber thongs or work boots
- Clothing with large or offensive slogans or advertising

The Board recognises that where an external function is held at the Club for the financial benefit of the club that some guest may not meet the above expectations

and tolerance will be shown. This tolerance does not extend to members and their invited guests.

Our new dress code embraces the more relaxed style of dress common within the general community. Please do not interpret this as acceptance of poor or untidy dress. Help us maintain the good standards we currently enjoy.
